SERVICE LINE INVENTORY Q&A



When is the initial inventory due?

The due date is October 16, 2024.

Can service lines be classified as non-lead based on install date?

Yes, service lines installed after 1985 (1/1/1986) are considered non-lead because this was when the state lead ban was enacted.

How are lead goosenecks considered for service line definitions?

Lead goosenecks are NOT considered a source of lead in the definitions of lead service lines or galvanized requiring replacement.

Can statistical analysis be used to classify unknown service lines?

Yes, but Oregon has specific requirements for this process. See "Statistical Guidance for Unknowns" in the resources below.

Can service lines >2 inches be classified as non-lead?

Yes, any service line with a diameter of 2 inches or greater can be categorized as non-lead.

Can water sampling be used to classify the service line?

No, lead sampling results for a home (or connection) cannot be used to determine of a lead service line for reporting on the inventory.
